Unpaid Carer Information Pack

An unpaid carer is someone of any age (adult or child) who looks after a friend or family member who, due to illness, frailty, disability, mental health problems or addiction, cannot cope without their support. The care they give is unpaid.

Help and support is available

This pack provides general advice and guidance to unpaid carers about what type of support is available and where to find it

You are important – Take care of yourself

Looking after someone often means we neglect to look after ourselves. Be aware of your own physical and mental health. It will help you maintain your emotional wellbeing and the quality of care you give.

Why this pack might help you

It contains details of local and national agencies that offer a wide range of support, advice and guidance, along with practical help and wellbeing services for unpaid carers.

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What support can Modality Lewisham offer you?

Our services are there to support you. They include:

- **Practical help** so that Modality services are accessible for you and the person you care for, to print forms and enable you to manage medical services for the person you care for online via linked profiles (proxy access)
- **Digital inclusion hub** to help you use our online services
- **Pharmacist** for expert advice about medication
- **Physiotherapist** for help with joint and muscle issues
- **Information and advice** via tables in our waiting area
- **Carer peer support** including coffee and chats with other carers
- **Well-being coordinator** to connect with local activities
- **Mental Health Practitioner** for guidance and referral for more help if needed

Other steps you can take to get support you may need:

Register with Imago Community

Lewisham Council contracts with Imago Community to provide information, support, advice and guidance to unpaid carers. Services include:

- A walk-in support hub and telephone helpline
- A **Carer's Assessment** to determine your needs and get a personal support plan
- Emotional support including access to free counselling and peer support groups

- Financial support and benefits advice
- Social activities and day trips
- A digital newsletter for carers who choose to register

Do you need help planning for the future?

Please remember, when your caring responsibilities change - such as a care home placement or a bereavement - support for you can continue.

Have you considered lasting power of attorney (LPA)?

A lasting power of attorney (LPA) is a legal document that lets the cared for person (the 'donor') appoint one or more people (known as 'attorneys') to help them make decisions or to make decisions on their behalf. There are two types of LPA: 'Health and Welfare' and 'Property and Financial Affairs'. They can choose to make one type or both.

This can help carers have more control over what happens to the person they care for if they have an accident or an illness and cannot make their own decisions (they 'lack mental capacity'). www.gov.uk/power-of-attorney

Please note: In common with some other services provided by Lewisham Adult Social Care, care home fees are means-tested. Lewisham Adult Social Care can carry out a financial assessment as part of a **Care Needs Assessment** which will determine who will be responsible for paying any care home fees
